

Mardi Gras/Fat Quarter Sew Day Supply List-2026

-Sewing machine that you are familiar with

-basic sewing supplies; coordinating thread, seam ripper, pins/wonder clips, marking pen/pencil, scissors, etc.

-mat, ruler, rotary cutter

***Pick the quilt you would like to make and be sure to do the prep work prior to the class. Samples are hanging at Top Shelf Quilts. You will receive one of the two Villa Rosa patterns free, and your pattern(s) will be given to you on the day of the event. ***If you participated last year, bring your finished quilt top (doesn't need to be quilted or bound) to be entered in the Show & Tell raffle. **Last year's quilts were: 2M Junior, Genoa, Lindina & Miss Josie.**

Luv Ya – 45” x 63”

-Hearts – 6 Fat Quarters

-Background 1 – 1 ¼ yards (white in store sample)

-Background 2 – 1 ¼ yards (black in store sample)

-Binding – ½ yard binding

Prep Work:

Heart Fabric - Cut 18 pairs 5” x 9 ½” rectangles (three sets from each fat quarter)

Black & White cut:

- 9 – 10” x 10” square of each color
- 18 – 5” x 5” squares of each color
- 36 – 2” x 2” squares of each color

Mark a diagonal line across the back of all 5” and 2” black and white squares.

Mark a diagonal line across the back of each 10” white square (or the lighter of your two background colors).

You will need a square ruler to square up your HST's to 9 ½” in class.

Lantern – 60” x 84”

-Main Fabric - 12 Fat Quarters

-Background Fabric – 3 yards

-Binding – ¾ yard

*****All strips are cut width of fabric**

Prep Work:

Main Fabric – from each FQ – cut (5) 2 ½” x 21” strips and (4) 2 ½” squares

Background – cut (30) 2 ½” x WOF strips then cut in half, so you have (60) 2 ½” x 21” strips

cut (11) 2 ½” x WOF strips and sub cut into (96) 2 ½” x 4 ½” rectangles

***Sew a 2 ½” x 4 ½” background rectangle to each side of a 2 ½” main fabric square and press the seams OPEN (you should have 48)

Julia – 68” x 68”

-Fabric A (Accent squares) - 7 Fat Eighths or 4 Fat Quarters (store sample used 4 FQs)

-Fabric B (Main Fabric) – 6 Fat Quarters & 1 Fat Eighth (or a 7th Fat Quarter)

-Background – 3 yards

-Binding – ½ yard

Prep work:

-Fabric A – if using 7 Fat Eighths: from 6 of them, cut (4) 4 ½” squares from each and from 1 of them, cut (2) 4 ½” squares. If using 4 Fat Quarters: from 3 of them, cut (6) 4 ½” squares from each and from 1 of them, cut (8) 4 ½” squares. You need a total of 13 matching pairs of 4 ½” squares.

-Fabric B – from 6 Fat Quarters, cut (4) 2 ½” x 8 ½” rectangles, (4) 2 ½” x 6 ½” rectangles, and (8) 2 ½” x 4 ½” rectangles; from the Fat Eighth or 7th Fat Quarter, cut (2) 2 ½” x 8 ½” rectangles, (2) 2 ½” x 6 ½” rectangles, and (4) 2 ½” x 4 ½” rectangles.

-Background – cut (1) 2 ½” x WOF strip and sub cut into (13) 2 ½” squares

- cut (3) 2 ½” x WOF strips and sub cut into (26) 2 ½” x 4 ½” rectangles

- cut (5) 2 ½” x WOF strips and sub cut into (26) 2 ½” x 6 ½” rectangles

- cut (3) 4 ½” x WOF strips and sub cut into (26) 4 ½” squares

- cut (3) 2 ½” x WOF strips and sub cut into (8) 2 ½” x 14 ½” rectangles

- cut (7) 2 ½” x WOF strips and set aside for the sashing

With the remaining background you will need to cut (2) 11 ¼” squares and (2) 21 1/8” squares for your setting triangles. This can be cut at class if needed. I strongly recommend starching before you cut these squares for your setting triangles.

Carly – 60” x 72”

-Fat Quarters – 10 (5 are **Fabric B** & 5 are **Fabric C**)

-Fat Eighths – 10 (5 are **Fabric A** & 5 are **Fabric D**)

-Background - 2 ½ yards

-Binding - ½ yard

Prep work: This quilt requires a lot of prep work prior to class, but you will be ready to sew.

You need 4 different fabrics for each block which are labelled A, B, C, D.

Group together the fabrics that you would like to use in each block. You will make 6 blocks from each group. Total of 30 blocks for your quilt.

Fabric A, B, C, D (You will cut these for each of your 5 combination fabrics.)

Fabric A - (6) 4" square

Fabric B - (18) 4" square

Fabric C - (18) 4" square

Fabric D - (6) 4" square

Background (BG) - (120) 4" squares & (60) 3 1/2 x 6 1/2" rectangles. This is for all 30 blocks.

Cut all squares in half along the diagonal. Each square will have 2 triangles.

You will be sewing on the **bias** so using starch on your fabrics can help prevent stretching. You will be using these triangles to make a variety of different HST's. I recommend you label your different HST's.

Refer to the picture to determine how many HST's you need to make for each fabric combination.

Take two of the triangles shown and sew them right sides together. Press open or toward the dark side and trim to 3 1/2" square.

If you have not squared the HST's prior to class, then you will need to bring a square up ruler.
